GUIDELINES FOR SAFETY and PEACE OF MIND

ALL TEAMS, please be considerate. Enter the training sanctuary (double white vinyl doors) with dogs on leash

(no flexi-leads). Park facing the white picket fences, giving others room to park.

Explore—Have Fun—Be pro-active and aware of your surroundings and dogs.

10/5: Be aware of what's going on around you within 10-feet. Within 5-feet ASK before entering human or

dog's spatial / comfort zone. Take a deep nose-to-navel breath and be your dog's advocate.

Adopted dogs must be assessed before joining a group class — All dogs must have seen a Veterinarian.

- Pups as young as 4-months are accepted into Level-I training. All dogs must be healthy and have wellness checks, especially in an environment where there will be multiple dogs and families.
- SAM (socialization and manners) off leash socialization may precede class. It is not mandatory or appropriate for ALL dogs. Puppies have a few minutes to engage with other pups/dogs, who match, in a safe, supervised environment.
- Be mindful that dogs are dogs! There is no guarantee of a positive dog-meet-dog interaction. It is your responsibility to take care of your puppy/dog and supervise children in a class environment.
- We flow into warm-ups (breathing, focus) and Awareness Centered Training—ACT begins.
- Dogs need to be introduced in a broad range of surroundings while being guided by their dog parent/guide.
- Energy flows and shifts, as does signals and cues from other dogs, people, children and the environment.
- Training takes place every day while living and learning with our dogs.
- Awareness and teaching by shaping good behavior and preventing reactive ones creates the difference.
